Parents of Nursery, Reception, Y1 & Y6 pupils

Information for return to school Monday 8th June

Please read the information below in conjunction with the previous letter sent home regarding our return to school and the risk assessments on the school website under the Parents section and then Coronavirus.

If at any time you or your child is feeling unwell, or are showing Coronavirus symptoms, please do not enter the school site. Please contact school to let us know if you begin to show symptoms.

If a child feels more comfortable wearing a face mask they can do so. However, only disposable face masks can be worn in school and must be replaced each day.

- Pupils wearing face covering are advised to:
 - wash hands thoroughly with soap and water for 20 seconds or use hand sanitiser before putting face covering on and after removing it.
 - Avoid touching face or face covering as you could contaminate them with germs from hands.
 - Change face covering if it becomes damp or you have been touching it.
 - Continue to wash hands regularly.
 - Change and wash face covering daily.
 - If the material is washable, was in line with manufacturer's instructions. If it is not washable - dispose of it carefully in the normal waste.
 - Practise SD whenever possible

Pupil with symptoms -

- Parent MUST organise a test
- Positive result = 14 days isolation AND all other people in their bubble & other people they have been in contact with to be tested
- Negative result = proof to be given to school before anyone in the bubble is allowed back to school

Rest of people in bubble:

- Sent home with recommendation of having a test
- If above person comes back positive - they MUST have test and follow Public Health guidelines - 14 days isolation
- If above person comes back negative - they can come back to school

Dropping off or collecting children

Children will have a staggered arrival/exit to and from school. Nursery children will arrive at 9.00am entering by the patio doors at the side of the nursery, Reception 9.00am via the reception entrance, Y1 9.15am via the Y1 entrance and Y6 9.30am

via the Y6 entrance. For Reception, Y1 and Y6 children, staff will meet children on the yard. All children will have their temperatures checked on arrival. If they have a high temperature, children will not be allowed to stay in school.

Only one adult should enter the schoolyard with children (Y6 can come to school alone should parents/carers give them permission). Please be aware that social distancing measures should be maintained at all times on school premises. Collection times will be 11.00 am-11.15 am Nursery, 3.00pm Reception, 3.15pm Y1 and 3.30pm Y6. **No adults will be allowed into the school building.** Any appointments will be telephone only.

Children who are currently in the priority group (key workers and vulnerable), should continue to arrive at school as they currently do, i.e. 8.55am via the main entrance. Collection time will continue to be 3.15pm for KS1 children and 3.30pm for KS2 children, via the main entrance.

Break times and Lunchtimes

All bubbles will have their own staggered break times (except Nursery and Reception, who will have continuous provision). Break times will be supervised by staff, to ensure social distancing is adhered to as much as possible.

Class 'bubbles'

Children will stay in their class bubbles throughout the school day. They will not mix with other children or staff in other bubbles. Whilst we will do everything we can to enforce social distancing, the nature of learning in primary schools, particularly in the early years, means that we cannot guarantee children will not come into contact with others within their bubble.

Expectations of behaviour

We have amended our school behaviour policy to reflect the changes in practice the return to school following the COVID-19 disruption. Please share this information with your child.

COVID-19 Amendment

Behaviour principles

In light of the need for children to behave differently when they return to school, following the COVID-19 outbreak, amendments have been made to our behaviour policy. Behaviour policy changes will also need to be communicated to pupils, parents and staff.

Areas schools may wish to add to their behaviour policy are:

- Children will be expected to follow and adhere to the altered routines for arrival and departure in school, once a return to school is established

- Children must follow school instructions for hygiene on return to school, including handwashing and sanitising
- Children must follow instructions from staff about who they can socialise with at school
- Children will be expected to follow instructions from staff about moving around school. (this may involve maintaining social distance, queuing and out of bound areas as well as maintaining social distance
- Children should follow staff instructions relating to sneezing, coughing and use and disposal of tissues ('catch it, bin it, kill it') and follow instructions to avoid touching their mouth, nose and eyes with their hands
- Parents/children will be expected to tell staff if their child is experiencing symptoms of coronavirus
- Children should follow instructions from staff about sharing of any equipment, including water bottles
- Children will be expected to follow instructions from staff relating to expectations about break and playtimes, including where they can and cannot play and who they can play with
- Children will be expected to follow instructions from staff about how and when toilets can be used
- Children must not cough or spit at or towards any other person whilst in school
- Children who are not in school, but are taking part in remote online learning, must behave as if they were in school. Poor behaviour will not be accepted and appropriate actions will be taken by staff when and if necessary
- Rewards and sanctions will continue to play an important part of school life. Staff will use them when they feel it is appropriate

Water bottles

All children will get their own new water bottle. This will be filled up by children in school every morning. The water bottle will stay in school and should not be shared or swapped with any other pupils. Nursery children will use disposable plastic cups.

PE kit

Children should bring a PE kit into school on a Monday morning. This will stay in school for the week and can be taken home and washed on a Friday. Early Years children should change their uniform every day.

Uniform

Children should change their uniform as regularly as possible when coming to school. Each Friday will be a non-uniform day, when children can wear appropriate clothing for school that is not regular uniform.
