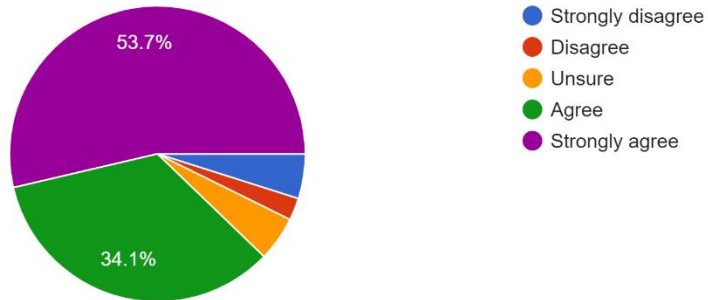

My child is happy at school

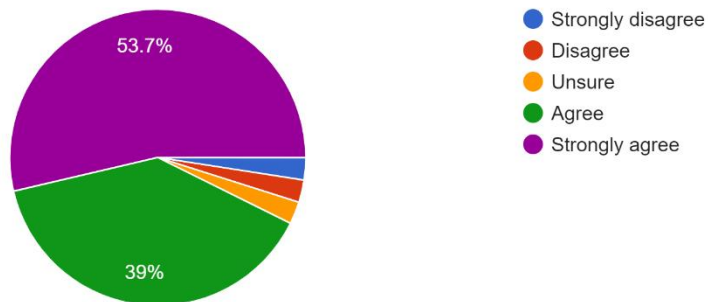

My child feels safe at school

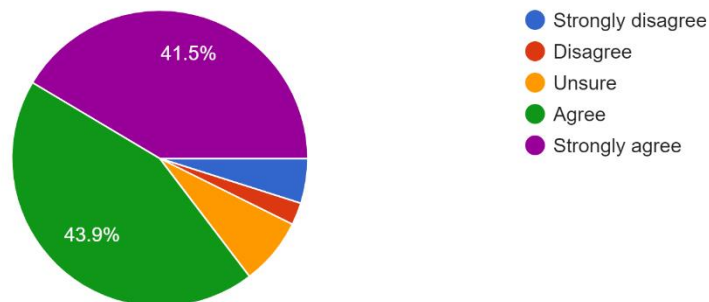

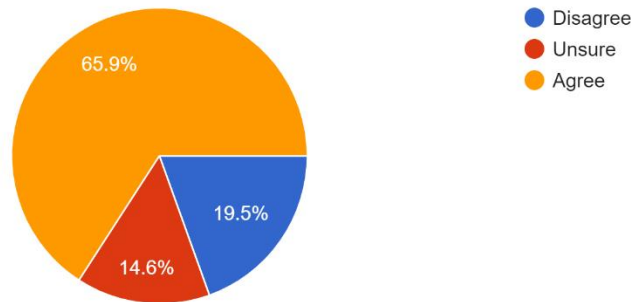

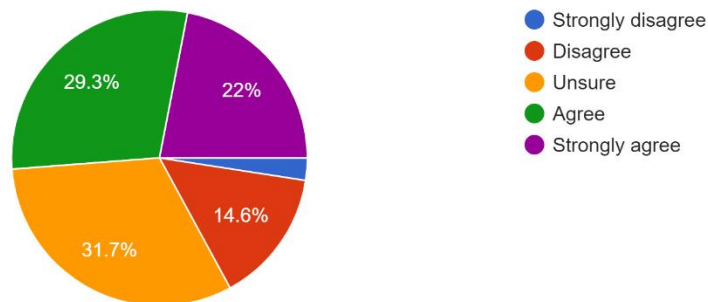

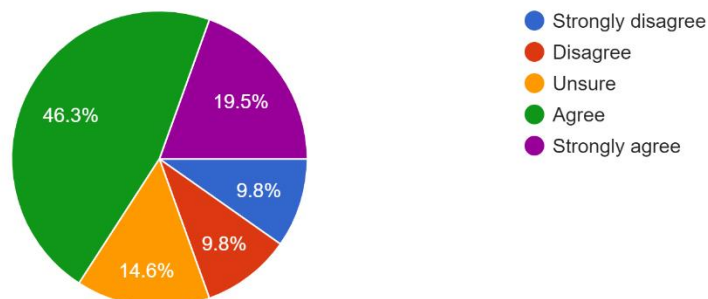

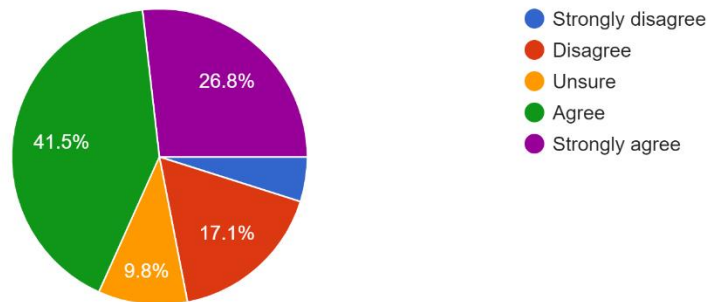

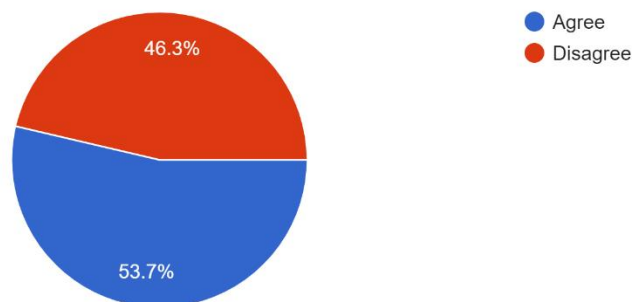

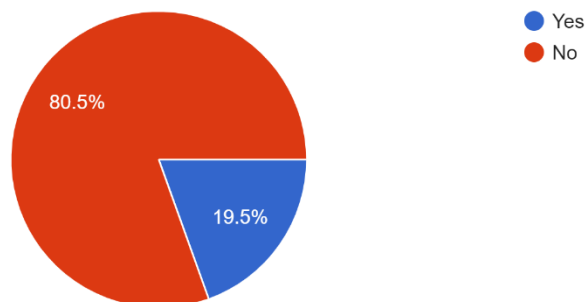

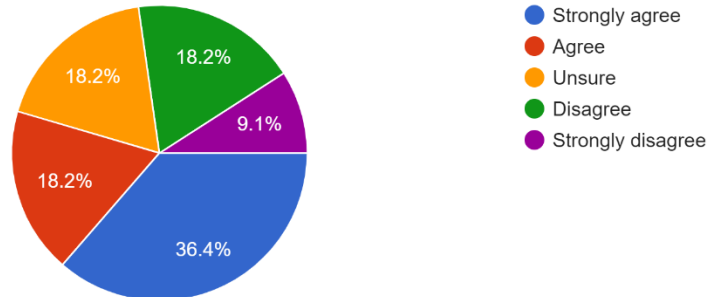

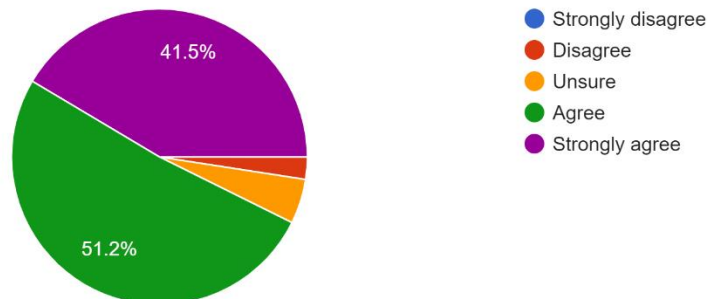

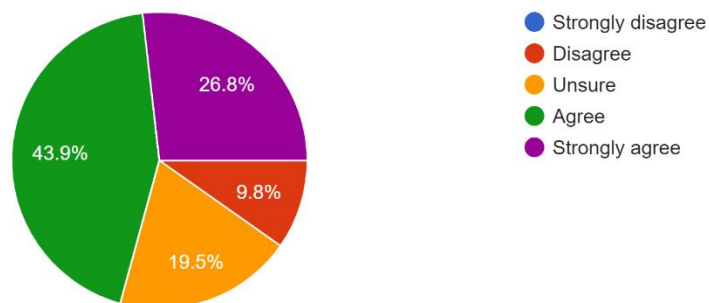

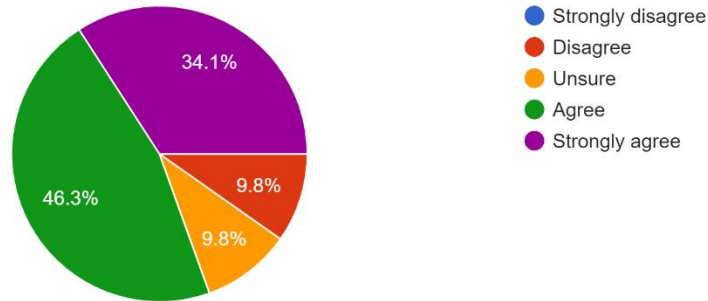

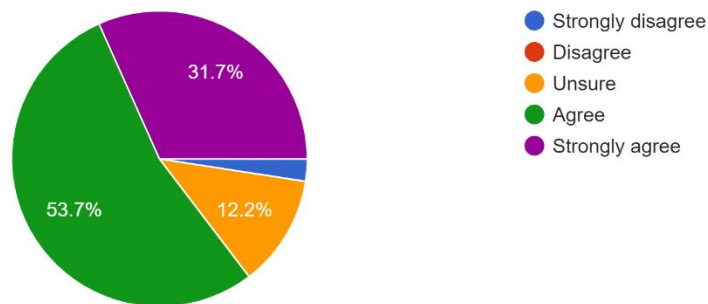

There are a good range of subjects available for my child at school

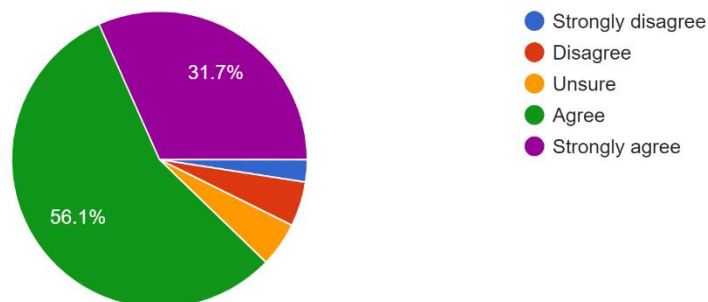

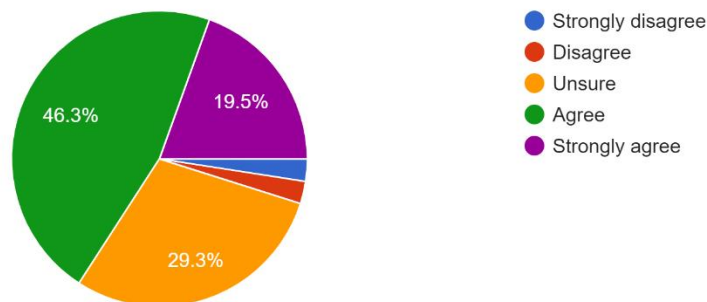

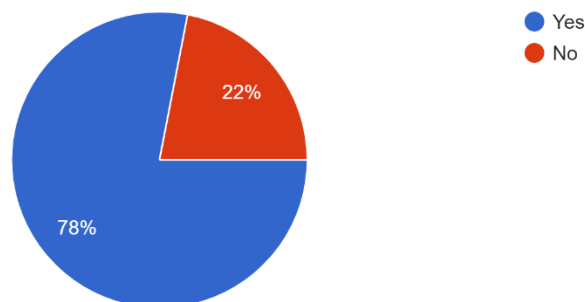

- ***Lunchtime supervision should be extended to the field. If already in place, perhaps more staff required to monitor poor behaviour?***

Our Lunchtime Supervisors cover the whole of lunchtimes, including when children are on the yard and the field. In terms of ratios of staff to children, we actually have more staff than the legal requirement. Lunchtime staff always monitor behaviour and on the rare occasion there are issues, they are reported to teachers immediately.

- ***The tutors could be a little more engaging with the parents***

Teachers are always happy to discuss any concerns or worries with parents. We do however ask, that if parents/carers want to speak to teachers, they make an

appointment via the school office. The start of the school day is a busy time and we need to start lessons promptly with such a full timetable. Staff also have a duty of care to ensure children enter school safely. Unfortunately, teachers are not able to talk to parents/carers on the yard as children enter school unattended, as this is a potential safeguarding risk.

- ***From having my other children at this school, i never had any issues. But since my daughter has started here I'm not too happy. Yes she's doing great academically but I do think that children now are just numbers, their needs are met how they should be. I feel the communication between the school and parents is not very good, compared to how it used to be.***

I am sorry to hear that you feel the needs of your daughter, beyond her academic progress, are not being met. I can assure all parents/carers that children are certainly not just numbers at Hadrian Primary School. We have a strong ethos in school that focuses on developing the whole child both emotionally and socially. We value giving children opportunities to discover new skills and build confidence, with events such as the Summer Spectacular.

It is difficult to be able to comment further without more information. However, if you would like to make an appointment, I would be more than happy to discuss your concerns further.

- ***I am not happy with the education that my child receive, there is no stander of teaching or supervision. I don't think my child have learned much this year or has developed in areas like math , English or grammar. I had to study with her very hard for the SAT exam (which we didn't get any feedback ) and I have noticed a lot of gaps in her knowledge and her performance is below the average level .***

It is difficult to be able to comment further on your child's progress, without more information. However, if you would like to make an appointment, I would be more than happy to discuss your concerns further. If your child is in Y6, the results of KS2 national tests were released last week. If your child is in Y2, national tests are no longer compulsory and these tests are used only to support teacher assessment.

- ***We dont know what is being taught in the school. We have raised this many times but it seems like no one care. We eventually stopped asking the teachers. We asked for extra support and work which was done for a couple of weeks but then stopped. I dont think my child is doing well in the school and I cannot recommend this school to someone else as the overall performance have gone down over the years.***

My main concern is around clear communication, often messages appear to not have been proofread, or multiple emails will be sent about the same thing, then nothing about others until the last minute. Or, sometimes an announcement will only be made on Google Classroom or Facebook, but then not an email which is, in my opinion, a better method. I know***

*this comes over as a rant, and it isn't to detract from all the wonderful teaching and learning, but it is frustrating.*

Thank you for your comments. We communicate with parents in a number of ways, particularly email and our Facebook page as well as letters and newsletters and occasionally through other social media outlets such as X (formally known as Twitter),

but staff also use things like Google Classroom and Seesaw to also communicate with parents. Teaching staff do not have access to sending blanket emails to parents, these

only come from the school office. Often, when the message relates only to their class, teachers will use Google Classroom to communicate with parents/carers. We communicate with parents in more ways now than we ever have, however, we will continue to strive to improve our communication and ensure that it is more consistent.

- ***Used to have a great sendco woman was always very supportive and helpful in every possible way, the new woman seems to be very inexperienced to the previous one and isn't as helpful and knowledgeable as a sendco person should be I have met alot of sendco workers in the past 16 years and in my opinion isn't right person to be dealing with a full school of people with send needs***

Miss Chapman was an experienced SENCO, who carried out the role for a number of years at Hadrian. Like Mrs Fox, she began the role as a new SENCO, with no previous experience and gained her knowledge and understanding whilst carrying out the role. This will be exactly the same for Mrs Fox, who holds the national SENCO qualification required for the post and shadowed Miss Chapman for a lengthy period before she retired. Mrs Fox is dedicated and committed to the role of SENCO and the needs of our children. She has already gained a wealth of experience in her first six months in the role and she will continue to work tirelessly for the benefit of our children.

- ***Our son is generally happy going to and coming from school and speaks positively about his time there. He has mentioned 'mean behaviours' of certain children and name-calling etc, but I wouldn't necessarily class this as bullying, but social development f the children since I know his teacher is very aware and alert to it. Apart from parents' evenings twice a year for 5 minutes each time, I don't know what my son is learning as his homework isn't marked and whenever asked about his day, get the response "I don't know" (typical of a 6 yo!) It would be great to understand more about the activities and lessons throughout the year, his application to them and development from them and where we can support to improve that in partnership with the teacher/school.***

Please rest assured that there are minimal 'mean behaviours' in school. Generally, children are very supportive of each other and our school has a strong ethos. Pupils play and work well together. As children progress through primary school, they are

learning about appropriate behaviour in both play and relationships and this understanding becomes stronger the further they progress through school.

It is difficult to know which homework you are referring to, but it is worth speaking directly to the class teacher if you do have concerns.

- ***The school is under funded ,a lot of inconsistency academic wise lots of supply teachers in infant years , not a lot of field trips . Office stuff is not friendly at all.***

You are correct in saying that the school is underfunded. This is very true and we have been for a number of years. This has had and continues to have a huge impact on all areas of school life from staffing, to field trips, although when and where we can, we continue to try and provide opportunities. Staff training, commitment to other roles and absence have contributed to the use of supply staff in the infant years. Where this has been the case, we have tried to always use the same staff so that there is consistency for children.

We are continuing to work hard with staff to ensure that parents/carers feel school is approachable and friendly.

- ***I would like more homework, especially for maths and spelling.***

Depending which year group children are in, the amount and type of homework provided can differ greatly. If you have concerns, or you want to support your child more at home, your child's class teacher will be able to advise you.
