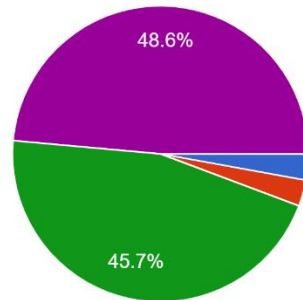

My child is happy at school

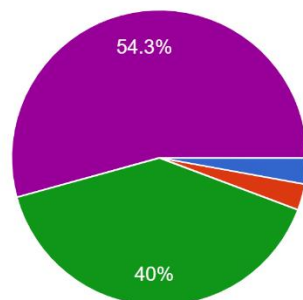

My child feels safe at school

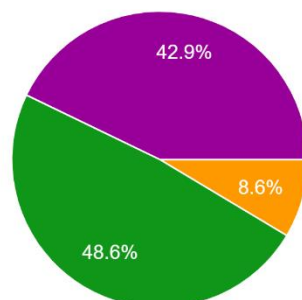

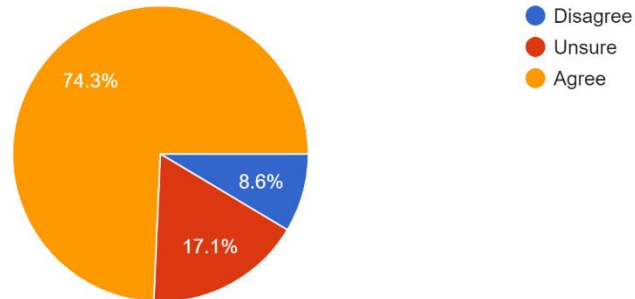

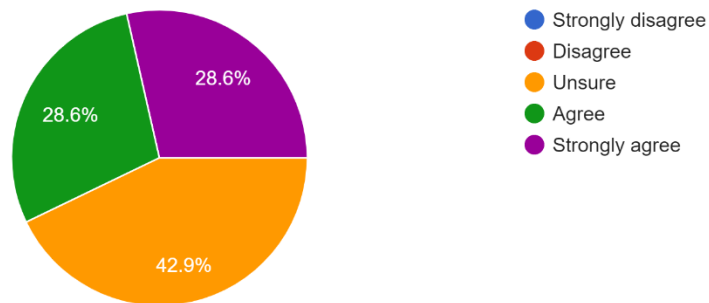
My child has not been bullied

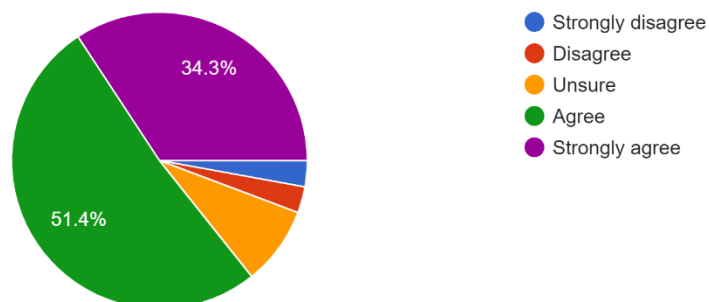
If my child has been bullied, the school have dealt with it quickly and effectively

The school makes me aware of what my child will learn during the year

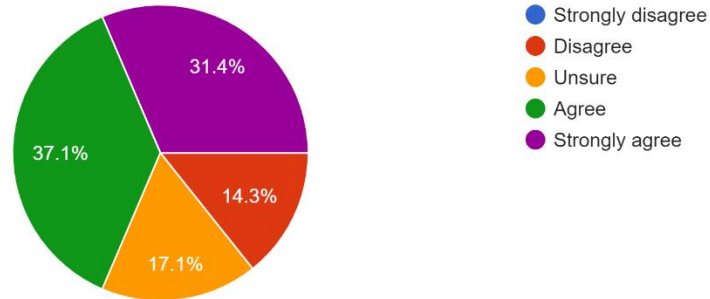

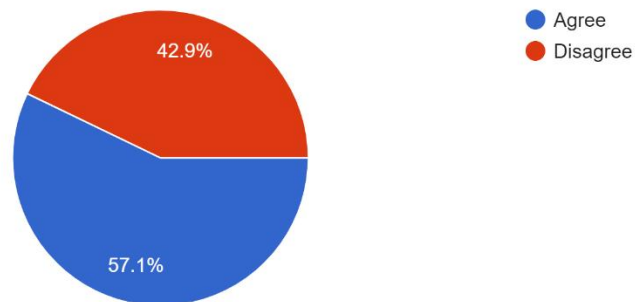
When I have raised concerns with the school, they have been dealt with effectively

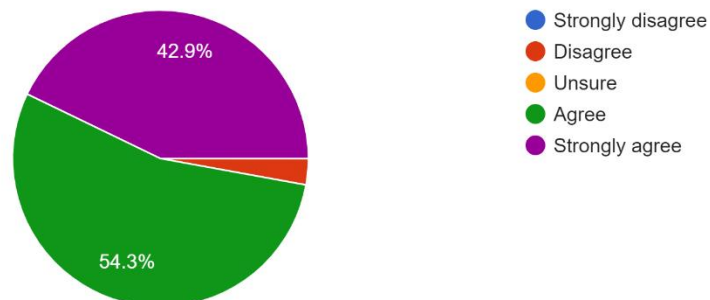

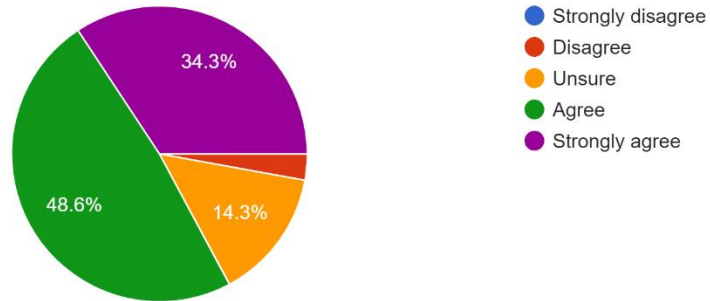
My child does well at school

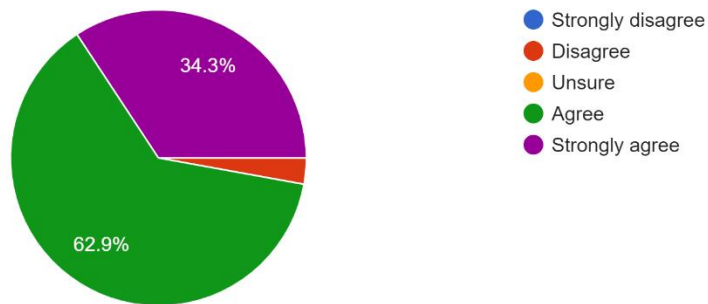

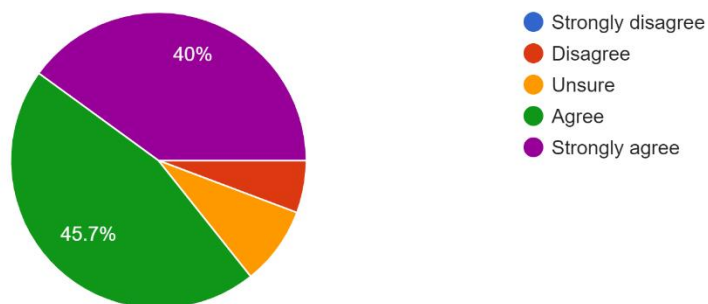
The school has high expectations of my child

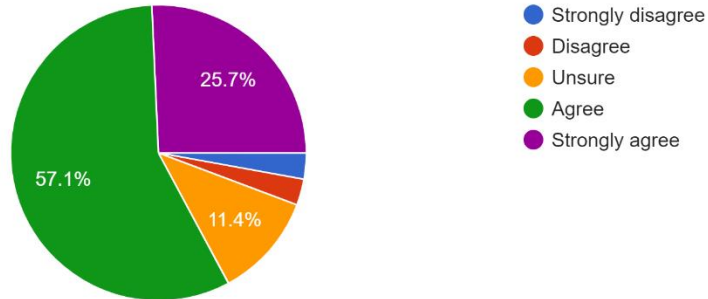
There are a good range of subjects available for my child at school

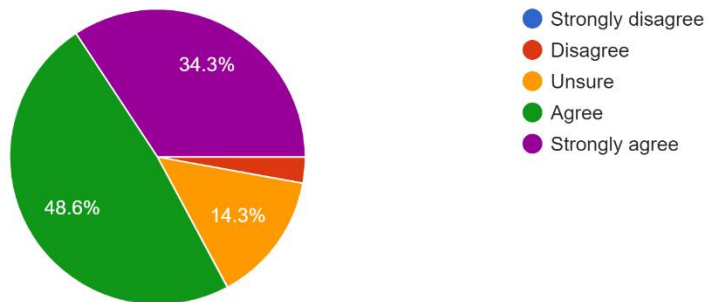
My child can take part in clubs and activities at this school

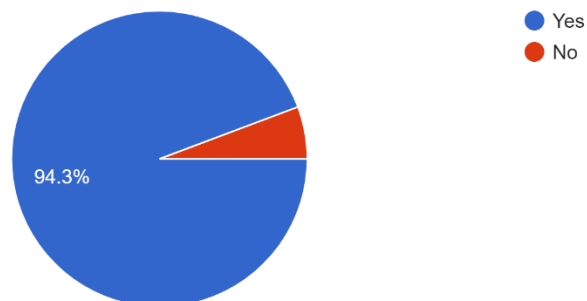
The school supports my child's wider personal development

- We are in complete dark that what kids are studying in the terms. We used to get a template of every term but not anymore. I even raised this with the kid class teacher but there was no action. This is regardless of which year kids are. Kids get homework once a week, that's where we assume that the kids are doing this topic but we don't have a plan. For number of years, I have asked the teachers in parent meetings that if the parents can be told that what school is teaching in next fortnight so that we can help our kids but I left the home. Not all kids are the same and my kids need parents help, otherwise they will fall too short of the syllabus. But without school helping parents, this is not possible. Unfortunately, in the parent meetings, we get to know all good things about our kids which I feel is not an honest feedback from the teachers. We also only get to know that what our kids are doing in the parent meetings which only happens a couple of times in school year. That is too late to be honest. I received a letter of having my kid an extra help in maths and when I enquired about it, the teacher said that's because she is not doing well in that subject. If the teachers can let parents know in good time, we can help our kids. But again, parents are in dark that what's going on in school.

Information on what areas of the curriculum are being covered, can be found on the school website on both the class pages and under the curriculum section of the school website. We will reintroduce our termly topic booklet in September, to help parents support their children at home. During parent's evenings, teachers will always highlight areas of strengths and progress for each individual child. However, they should also inform parents of areas that children need to improve in and how they can do this. Staff will always be happy to meet with parents and discuss areas of concern, if they are worried.

- Not able to meet my child's SEN needs

Hadrian Primary School has a very strong reputation for supporting children with SEND. We have held the Inclusion Quality Mark for nine years now, being graded as Outstanding in each of the three inspections for the award. Our Inclusion Manager Miss Chapman works closely with our support team to ensure that the individual needs of children are met and she meets regularly with parents. If any parents feel their child's needs are not being met, they should make an appointment to speak to her to discuss their concerns.

- The school is Amazing. It just seems to have a problem with the split classes. This has resulted in my child being told different things causing her to be very upset. When I ask the teachers they all just pass the blame to someone else.

We are unable to avoid split classes due to our Pupils Admission Number being 40. This means that we are unable to refuse a place to any child in any year group until we reach 40 in each year group. The Pupils Admission Number is decided by the local

authority, based on calculations they make of teaching spaces. We have no input or control of this number. Split classes have been a normal part of Hadrian Primary School for over thirty years and it is something that staff are comfortable working with. Split classes do not impact negatively on our national test data and this has been demonstrated over time.

- More communication with the parents is necessary.

We communicate with parents in a number of ways, particularly email and our Facebook page as well as letters and newsletters, but staff also use things like Google Classroom and Seesaw to also communicate with parents. However, we will continue to strive to improve our communication and ensure that it is more consistent.

- The only problem I have with seesaw is every single child gets tagged in the posts even tho my child was on holiday. Also no reading book this whole year even tho he had one last year from starting so don't know where his bag has gone that we paid for along with the diary.

Children should have reading books changed regularly by staff. If this is not the case, please speak to your child's class teacher.

- Thank you for looking after Finn (Readshaw) since nursery. Despite taking a little while to settle down he has thrived and I am thrilled with how his confidence has grown and he has succeeded in being a part of everything the school has had to offer. He has loved his teachers and his time at Hadrian and you all have helped make him the person we're so proud of. Thank you.
- My child is now about to leave Year 6; he's been at Hadrian since he was 3. In that time, the staff have been wonderful: accepting of his differences, resourceful when problems cropped up, and supportive through everything we've had to deal with. I couldn't have asked for a better start in life for my child.

All of our Y6 children have been star pupils and great role models to his peers throughout their time at Hadrian. We are proud of all of them and wish them every success in the future!

- I think the class size is too big for my son (class 8 Mr Webster) so this should be considered going forward

Mr Webster's class size was due to the issue with our Pupils Admission Number as mentioned in the response above. Additional support staff were placed into the class to ensure learning was not impacted by the large class size. This is something that we are always mindful of
