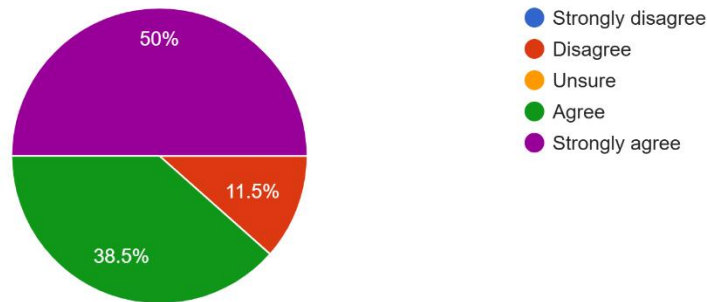

My child is happy at school

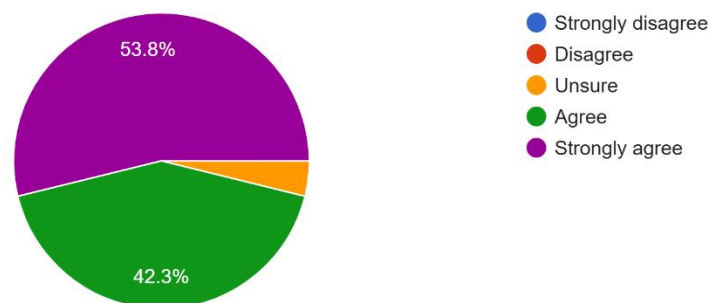

My child feels safe at school

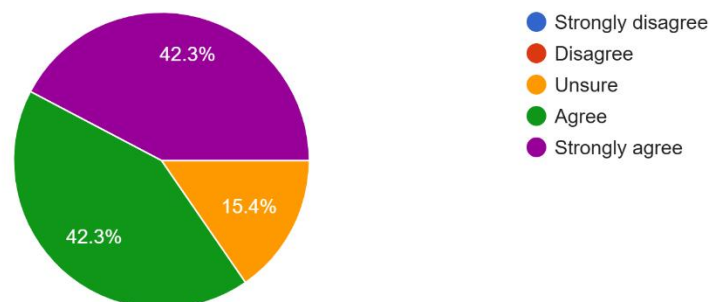

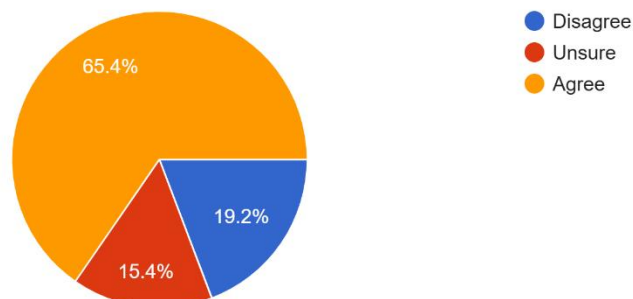

My child has not been bullied

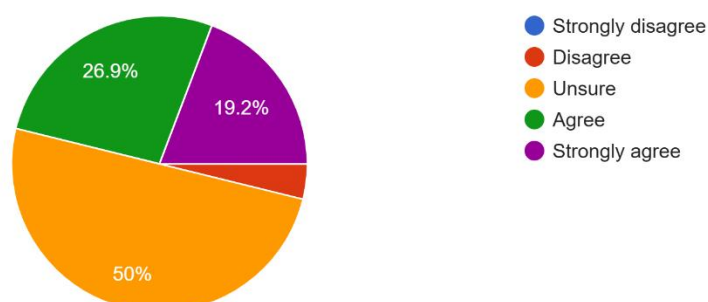

If my child has been bullied, the school have dealt with it quickly and effectively

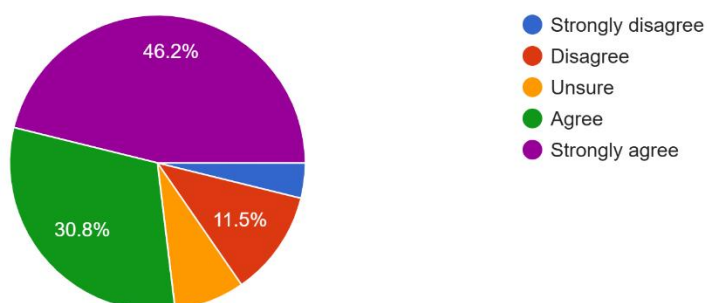

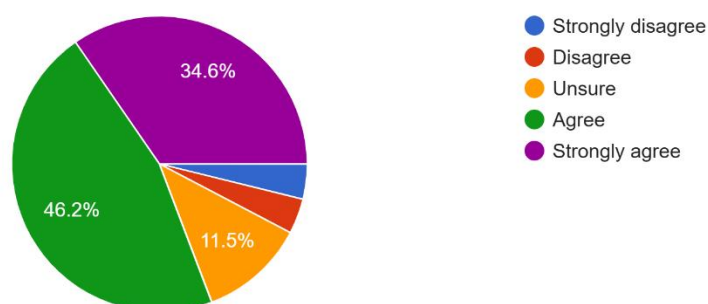

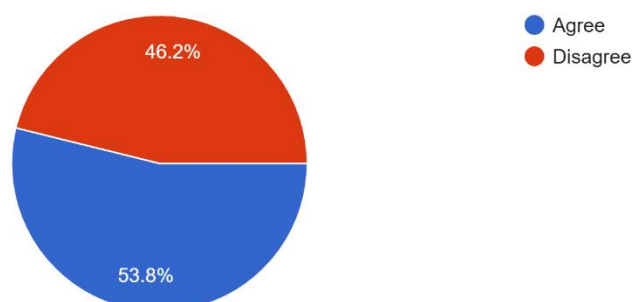

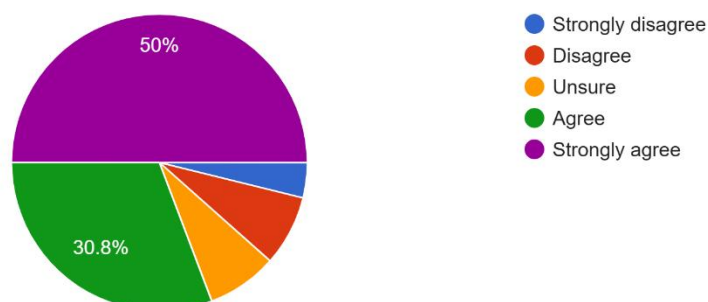

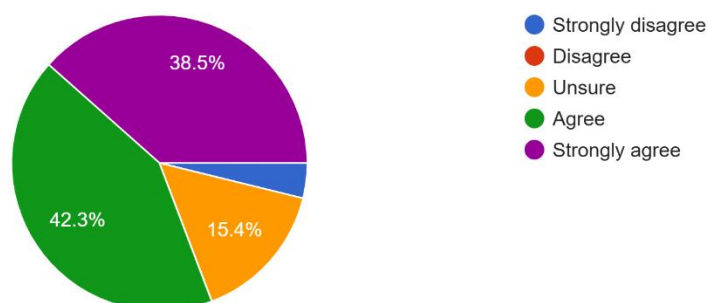

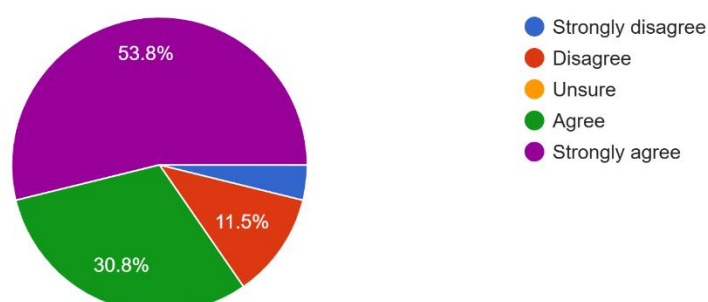

The school lets me know how my child is doing

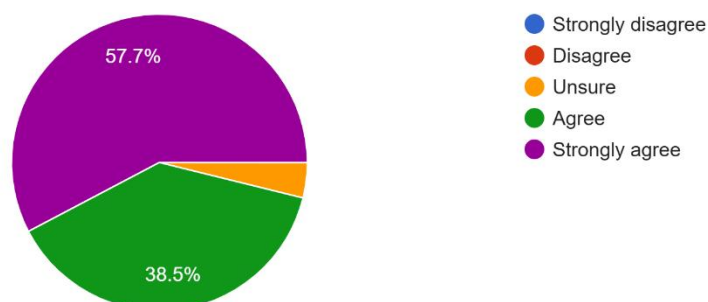

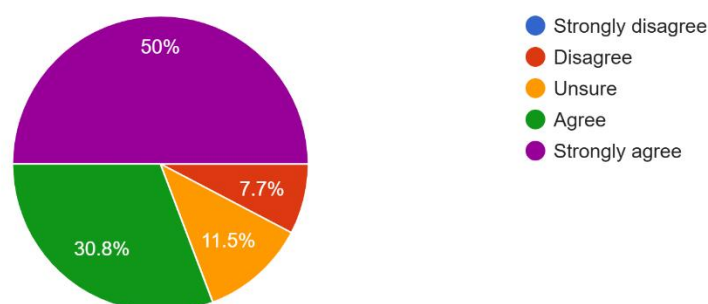

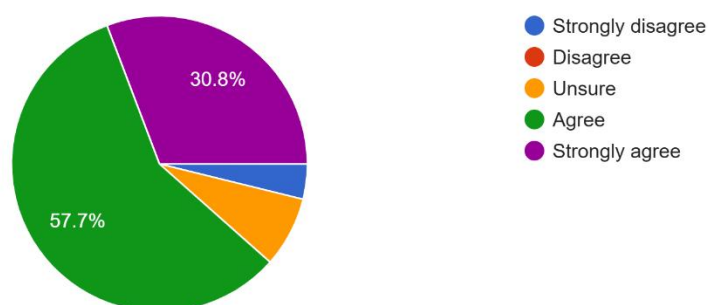

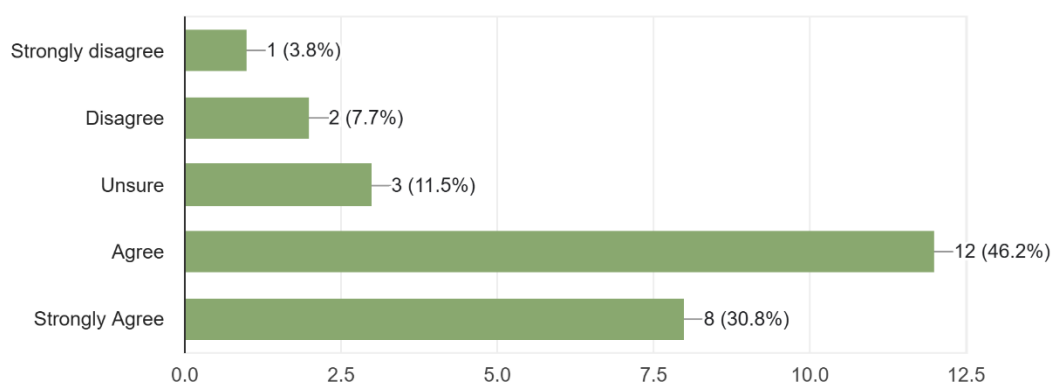

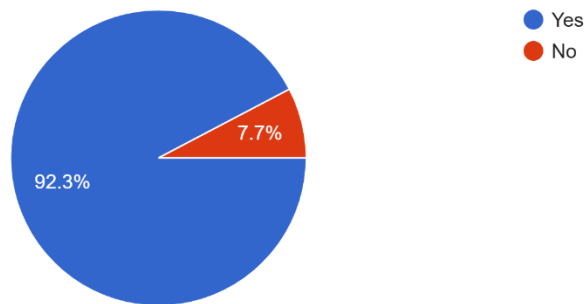

- School has dealt with all the issues swiftly and professionally. Would love to see a range of different after school activities like cooking dancing exercise (more fitted to girls). Not sure if everything should be posted on social media. Staff kept me informed throughout. Lady on reception very friendly and prompt.***

We are pleased to hear that you are happy with the way issues you have raised have been dealt with. We always try to deal with issues raised by parents/carers as swiftly as possible. In terms of clubs, we are always looking to expand our offer, but we are limited by what providers can offer us and whilst we would like to offer a more diverse range of activities, sadly this is not always possible. That being said, we are hopeful that we may be able to offer a dance club during the autumn term.

- I recently asked whether or not my son could do his work experience here. To be told that he couldn't because he was a past pupil. I think this is such a shame! My son wants to be a primary school teacher and to gain experience from his old primary school, would have been great!.*

I am sorry to hear your son was disappointed that we were not able to offer him work experience at Hadrian. Sadly, we have had a number of issues over the years with ex-pupils having work experience in our school and therefore made the decision to discontinue the offer. However, we are delighted to hear your son wants to be a primary school teacher and wish him all the best in his pursuit of a rewarding and fulfilling career.

- An observation, the teachers need to encourage the children to drink more. My child comes home from school with her water bottle full everyday!*

Staff encourage children to drink water regularly throughout each day. Children have access to their water bottles in every lesson and are encouraged to stay hydrated throughout the week.

- Please change your email domain filter on your website so it doesn't allocate to spam. This shouldn't need to be stated for a school that promotes cyber safety.*

The issue with school emails going into spam is not caused by the school email domain filter. We have discussed this at length with Arbor, our admin system provider and they have offered the following solution. Parents/carers should check with their email provider and look at specific instructions to take Arbor emails out of spam folder. Parents/carers will need to add the Arbor's domain to their email safe sender list. Arbor inform us that it is the parents/carers responsibility to add the domain to the safe sender list. The reason that emails are going into spam is that they are being bulk sent from Arbor to all parents/carers and this can trigger spam filters with some email providers. Whilst the school has limited control in how Arbor sends emails, we can

provide guidance and support to parents who are having issues. Thank you for your understanding.

- **Very difficult to establish what they are actually doing week to week. My children arrive home with bags of books in the last week of term. That's when I find out what they have been learning. I have had no opportunity to review any learning with them throughout the year, other than supervising My Maths and Edshed. It's frustrating as I am more than willing to help them go over tests etc at home to help them progress.**

Information on what areas of the curriculum are being covered, can be found on the school website on both the class pages and under the curriculum section of the school website. Termly topic booklets are provided to help parents support their children at home. During parent's evenings, teachers will always highlight areas of strengths and progress for each individual child. However, they should also inform parents of areas that children need to improve in and how they can do this. At the end of each term, parents also receive a progress report, which highlights how much progress their child has made during that term. Staff will always be happy to meet with parents and discuss areas of concern, if they are worried. If you would still like further information on what your child is doing in class, teachers will always be happy to discuss this with parents/carers.
