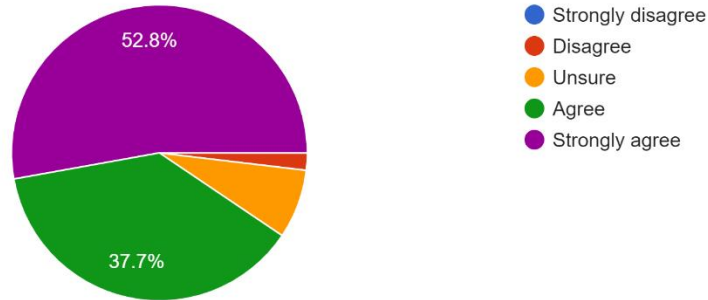

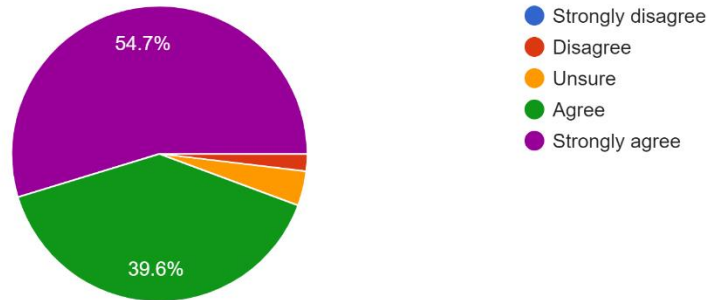
My child is happy at school

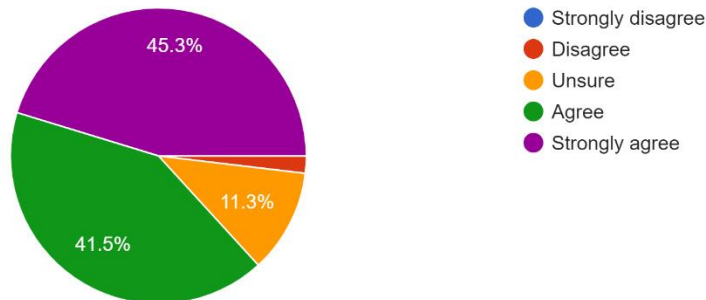
My child feels safe at school

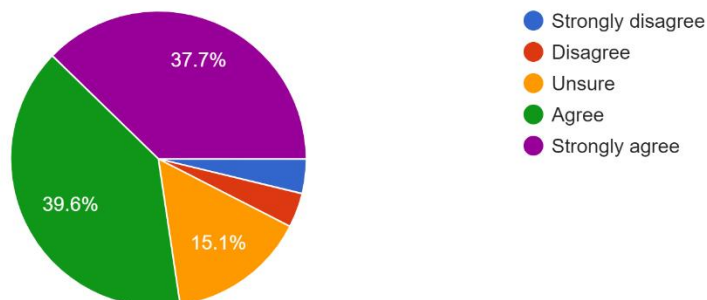
The school makes sure it's pupils are well behaved

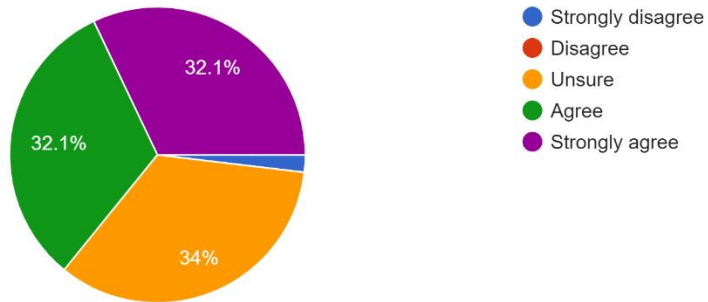
My child has not been bullied

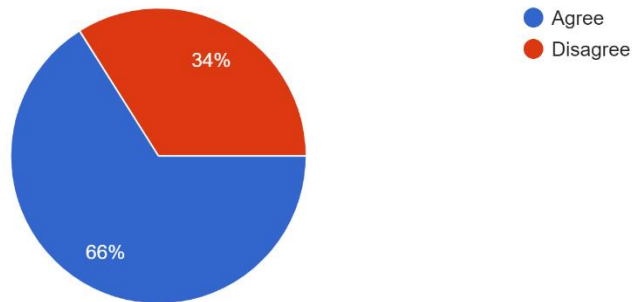

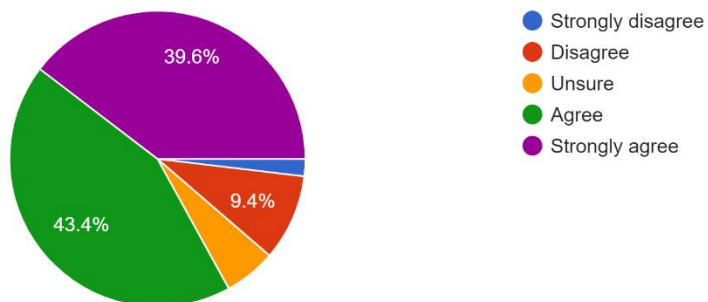
If my child has been bullied, the school have dealt with it quickly and effectively

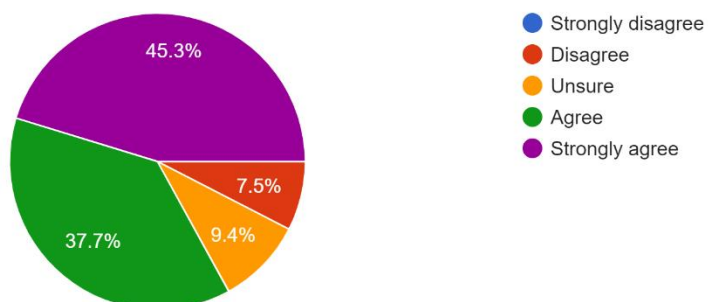

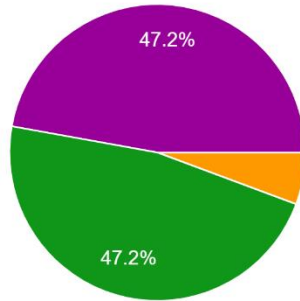

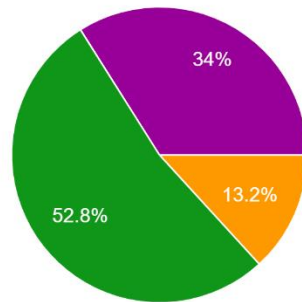

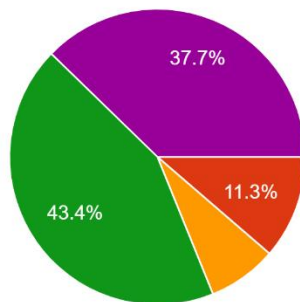

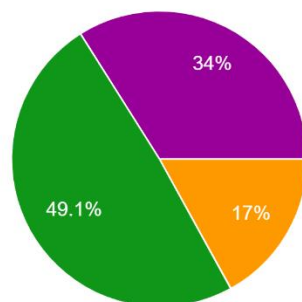

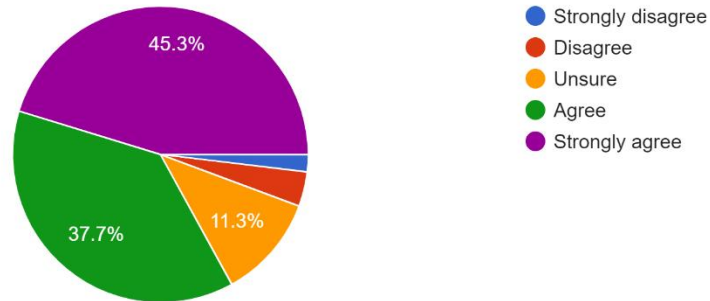

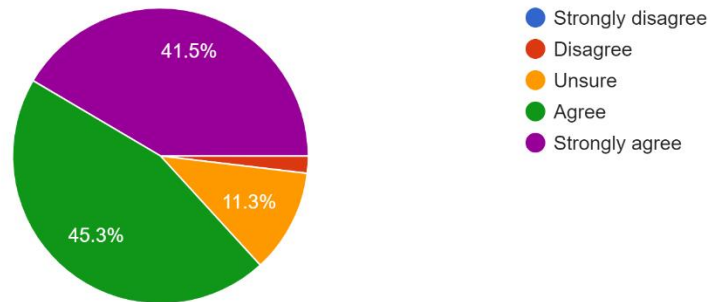
My child can take part in clubs and activities at this school

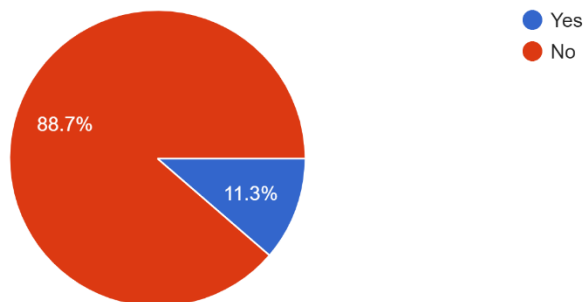
The school supports my child's wider personal development

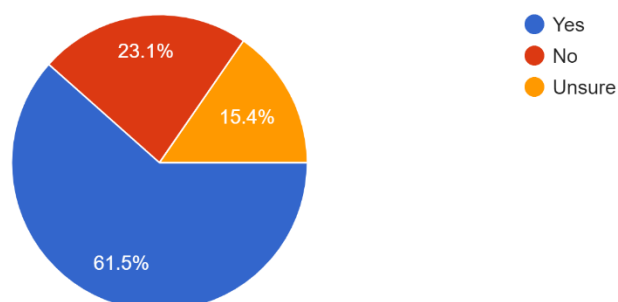
Does your child have special educational needs

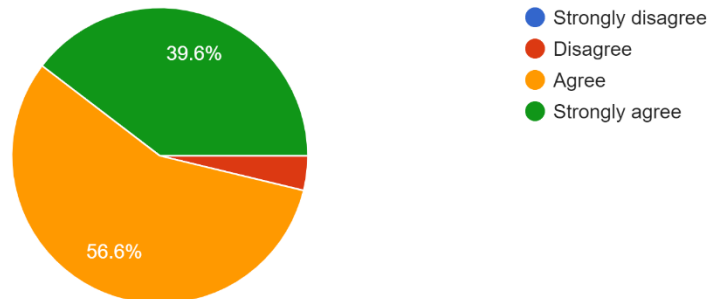

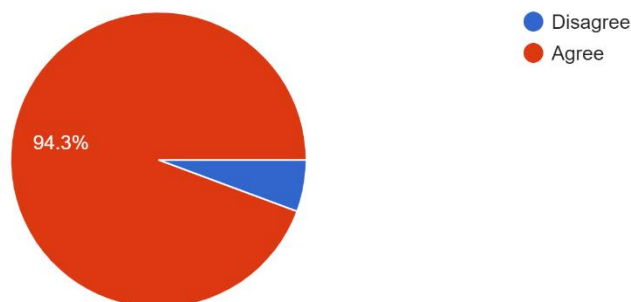
Overall, the school has managed to deal with the issues caused by the COVID-19 Pandemic effectively

- I feel more regular updates on how our child is doing in school would be very helpful. A monthly update via email would be great, rather than just parent's evenings etc. I don't feel like the school have fully taken into account the impact the pandemic has had on the mental health and development of the children. I do feel like the school make a big effort to engage the children in learning and manage and promote good behaviour.
As a staff, we are always looking at ways we can update parents on a more regular basis regarding children's progress. We plan to implement some of these ideas during the autumn term. The mental health and well-being of children has been a major focus for all staff since our return to full schooling in September 2021. The first two weeks of the autumn term were focused on pastoral issues and well-being. A range of PSHE and well-being initiatives have taken place throughout this academic year and where appropriate, small group or individual support for pupils has been provided.
- With Miss Gibson leaving nursery there hasn't been many updates on tapestry or the website of what my child has been doing or what nursery have been doing. We used to get updates couple times a month

There has been a number of staffing issues in the nursery this year including long term absence and staff leaving, all of which has created challenges. Inevitably, it has led to some disruption in terms of how nursery would normally operate. The staff involved have worked incredibly hard to ensure disruption has been kept to a minimum. However, with a new team now in place for September, we are anticipating a return to normal practice within the nursery and stronger parental links. We thank you for your understanding and patience during this period.

- I'm unsure about my son feeling safe due to his anxieties

All staff are incredibly supportive and sensitive to the feelings and needs of all children. Any child who is worried or concerned will be supported closely within school should they need it. If any parent/carer has concerns about their child, please inform staff, so we can provide the care they need.

- I am Marko's mother. He arrived from Ukraine on the 1st of June and I am so grateful for this school and all the amazing teachers and staff members ♥. My son loves going to school and feels sad that summer holidays are approaching. He absolutely loves the atmosphere and his teachers! Thank you for everything that you do and for being so friendly, helpful and professional! I couldn't have asked for a better school for my son even if I had that option.
- A lot of information does get left out because of teachers leaving. It has been hard for my daughter in nursery as she has had 2 teachers and 2 assist teachers leave suddenly. This made it harder for her to settle in school.

Whilst we appreciate and sympathise with the difficulty some children in nursery have had settling in, the staffing issues experienced this year have been beyond our control and the staff involved have done their best to minimise disruption. It has been an extremely unusual year in that sense and not one that is typical of normal years in our school. Going forward, with a new team in place, we hope to ensure we have settled routines and staff.

- I feel that some of the bullying issues were dealt with at the time but they have continued so I'm not sure if the problem overall is being handled correctly. Hadrian Primary is a school which fosters excellent relationships between peers and staff alike. It is a harmonious environment for children to learn and grow. However, on occasions, we do have situations where children fall out. Thankfully, it is very rare that we have incidents of bullying. However, we take these incidents very seriously and deal with them immediately. If parents or pupils have concerns that this kind of behaviour is continuing, we would ask you to inform us immediately so swift action can be taken.
- I hope that going forward we will have more interaction with the school. It is sad that Thurston has not been reinstated this year but hope it will for future years as big part of primary life. We missed the Xmas plays and summer spectacular but appreciate under the circumstances why they haven't gone ahead. My only other concern has been with regards to the overall size of my daughters class although I understand it is within remits however it seemed disproportionately large in comparison to other year groups.

Like many parents and carers, staff and pupils in school have found the last two and a half years very challenging. This academic year in particular had been extremely

difficult in terms of Covid infection rates particularly over the winter and early spring. Inevitably, it has meant that many of the events and activities that make up our normal school year have not been possible. It is our intention to return to our regular calendar of events in the next academic year.

Careful consideration is always given to the make up and size of classes in school. However, all schools have a set Pupils Admissions Number (PAN), which dictates the maximum size of year groups. Until the PAN is reached, individual schools cannot refuse entry to pupils requesting a place. On very rare occasions, large numbers of pupil transfers into the same year group can impact on the size of a class. In these very unusual circumstances, additional support is always put in place to support teaching and learning.

- I would have liked advanced information about mixed classes just so I was aware in advance of the start day.

Thank you for your suggestion. Mixed classes are determined by a number of factors, including the number of children we have in any given year and therefore can change from year to year. Going forward, when we inform parents of their child's new teacher, we will also include the year group (i.e. Mr Webster Y4, or Miss Dickson Y5/6).

- Our child is in nursery and we have very little clue as to what they are doing, we get very little information. Many of the questions here are poorly phrased (e.g. I have not raised concerns) and are likely to cause confusion - they do not give us the space to raise the things that are important.

As explained in a previous response, this has been a challenging year in staffing terms in nursery this year and does not reflect normal practice. A return to quality provision and communication will be in place from September.

We will look again at the wording of questions within our questionnaire. However, the 'I have not raised concerns' question follows the question 'When I have raised concerns, they have been dealt with properly', this allows us to gauge how many parents/carers have raised concerns. Any comments parents/carers wish to make can be added into the final section of the form.
